# the experience

The Pre-College Summer Session (PCSS) is a two and a half week, highly structured experience developed to guide serious art students on their creative journey.

Inside the classrooms and studios, trained staff and professional faculty guide and mentor them every step of the way. Students spend their days immersed in both foundational and intensive classes by major. Evenings and weekends provide a chance to have fun and relax, build new friendships, explore Minneapolis, and spend time working in the studios and labs.

Painting



## tuition & fees

#### \$3,500

Please note: Students in the painting major pay an additional \$100 materials fee. Students in the photography major pay a refundable \$150 equipment damage deposit.

campus life

Students stay in air-conditioned, furnished, apartment-style dorms located across an expansive lawn from the main building. Trained, upper-level MCAD students serve as oncampus resources, helping build community within a safe, supervised environment. All meals are provided through MCAD's cafeteria with special consideration given to a student's dietary needs.

free time

When not working in their studios, students relax on campus or head out on supervised excursions to Minneapolis sites, artists' studios, and more. All excursions are included in the tuition.

# Continuing Education at MCAD

MCAD also offers classes for teens in the summer, including Portfolio Preparation classes. Many adult classes are also open to teens ages 16 and up.

#### **Pre-College Studio Intensives**

Weeklong Pre-College Studio Intensives focusing on a specific MCAD major are offered in the summer. Pre-College Studio Intensives are worth one college credit.
